Monday 18 Aug	<input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 36:10-32; <input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 13:1 to 15:21	<p>Chapter 36 is the remarkable story of the burning of God's word—but it was not “destroyed,” for God caused it to be written again.</p> <p>In chapters 13-15, more signs of Judah's certain fall are given.</p>
Tuesday 19 Aug	<input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 16:1 to 18:23	<p>First, God tells Jeremiah not to get married due to the great punishment that was coming (chapter 16). Second, more sins of Judah are given and condemned (chapter 17). Third, Jeremiah gives the famous lesson on the potter and the clay (chapter 18).</p>
Wednesday 20 Aug	<input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 19:1 to 20:18; <input type="checkbox"/> II Kings 24:1; <input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 47:1 to 48:47	<p>Chapter 19 tells of the sign of the potter's vessel (flask). In chapter 20, Jeremiah is persecuted by Pashur.</p> <p>Chapter 47 is against various heathens, while chapter 48 is against Moab (descendant of Lot; Genesis 19:37).</p>
Thursday 21 Aug	<input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 49: 1-39 <input type="checkbox"/> II Kings 24:2-4; <input type="checkbox"/> II Chron 36:6,7; <input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 52:28; <input type="checkbox"/> II Kings 24:5,6; <input type="checkbox"/> II Chronicles 36:8; <input type="checkbox"/> II Kings 24:2-4 <input type="checkbox"/> II Chron 36:9 <input type="checkbox"/> Jeremiah 22:24-30 <input type="checkbox"/> II Kings 24:10-16; <input type="checkbox"/> II Chron 36:10; <input type="checkbox"/> Esther 2:5, 6	<p>The fall of several nations is predicted in Jeremiah 49. Then we go back to more of the historical events of Jeremiah's day.</p> <p>Jehoiachin (South; 3 evil months).</p> <p>Jeremiah 22:30 is VERY important. It teaches that no descendant of Jehoiachin (including Jesus) would EVER prosper as a king in the <i>earthly</i> city of Jerusalem.</p> <p>The other readings tell about some who were carried away to Babylon.</p>

Zedekiah (South; 11 evil years)

Jeremiah 21:1-14
 Jeremiah 22:1-9, 20-23
 Jeremiah 23:1-40

In Jeremiah 21 and 22, he prophesies against Zedekiah.

In Chapter 23, he predicts the coming of the BRANCH (Christ; see Zechariah 3:8; 6:12,13), and warns the priests and prophets.

Saturday

Jeremiah 24:1-10
 Jeremiah 27:12-22
 Jeremiah 29:1 to 30:34

Chapter 24 is his lesson about the two baskets of figs.. Chapter 27:12-22 is addressed to Zedekiah.

Chapter 29 is the record of letters to the captives. Chapter 30 is a chapter that gives them hope in spite of their sins.

Sunday
24 Aug

Jeremiah 31:1-40

 Jeremiah 28:1-17
 Jeremiah 51:59

Jeremiah 31 contains the famous promise of a new covenant, fulfilled by the giving of the New Testament (vv. 31-34; Hebrews 8:6-13).

Chapter 28 deals with a false prophecy by Hananiah. The last verse for this reading tells of a trip Jeremiah took to Babylon at this time.
