Monday 2 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Proverbs 20:1 to 23:25	The brief wise sayings of Solomon continue, covering many subjects that are needful today.
Tuesday 3 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Proverbs 24:1 to 27:27	In chapter 24, the brief proverbs continue. Then, many more of Solomon's proverbs are listed, as recorded by Hezekiah's men.
Wed 4 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Proverbs 28:1 to 30:33	Chapters 28 and 29 complete the proverbs of Solomon, while chapter 30 is attributed to Agur, the son of Jakeh.
Thursday 5 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> 1 Kings 11:1-14, 23-40	This reading begins with the fall of Solomon and the rise of Jeroboam. This is the setting that serves as an important help in understanding the rest of the Old Testament.
	<input type="checkbox"/> Ecclesiastes 1:1 to 3:22	Then we begin Ecclesiastes, Solomon's book about the vanity of any life that is not lived in obedience to God, largely drawn from his own personal experience.
Friday 6 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 49	Palm 49 has many of the same ideas found in the reading in Ecclesiastes.
	<input type="checkbox"/> Ecclesiastes 4:1 to 6:12	The chapters in Ecclesiastes give many sources of "vanity" in everyday life. Keep reading—the solution is in chapter 12.
Saturday 7 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Ecclesiastes 7:1 to 9:18	Solomon continues describing the vain lives that people live when they do not obey God. Much of this has the same ring as the book of Proverbs.
Sunday 8 Jun	<input type="checkbox"/> Ecclesiastes 10:1 to 12:14	Now he reaches his grand conclusion: Life is truly vain without God. Let us therefore respect Him and obey His commandments in order to prepare for judgment. Let us avoid growing old without God, as described in chapter 12.
