Monday 5 May	<input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 28; 143; 70; <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 40	<p>In the first three Psalms, the writer again desires 1) the Lord to hear his plea for deliverance and 2) vengeance upon the enemy.</p> <p>In Psalm 40:6-8, we have a statement that is applied to Christ in Hebrews 10:5ff.</p>
Tuesday 6 May	<input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 27; <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 69 <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 120; <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 121	<p>In Psalm 27, David is confident that the Lord will "hide" him.</p> <p>Psalm 69 is another statement of David's afflictions, with some more verses that are quoted in the New Testament.</p> <p>In Psalm 120 he says, "Deliver me from my bitter foes."</p> <p>And in Psalm 121, we have David lifting up his "eyes unto the hills."</p>
Wednesday 7 May	<input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 18:1-33 <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 10 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 19:1-10 <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 122 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 19:11-23	<p>We begin today with the tragic story of Absalom's fall and death.</p> <p>Psalm 10 is a detailed description of the wicked.</p> <p>Then Joab rebukes David for his grief over Absalom.</p> <p>In Psalm 122, David prays for Jerusalem.</p> <p>Finally, David returns to Jerusalem and pardons Shimei.</p>

Thursday 8 May	<input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 92 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 19:24-43 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 20:1-26 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 21:1-14	<p>Psalm 92 is a song of praise.</p> <p>Then we have accounts of David's relationships with various people in II Samuel 19.</p> <p>II Samuel 20 reveals the rebellion of Sheba and its consequences.</p> <p>In II Samuel 21, an agreement is made with the Gibeonites that cost the lives of seven men.</p>
Friday 9 May	<input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 29 <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 65 <input type="checkbox"/> 2 Samuel 21:15-22 <input type="checkbox"/> 1 Chronicles 20:4-8 <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 36	<p>In Psalm 29, "The voice of Jehovah shows glory and strength."</p> <p>In Psalm 65 we have the idea, "Praise God for His provisions for the earth."</p> <p>Then we read of David's last war with the Philistines.</p> <p>Psalm 36 contains a contrast between the wicked and those who "trust in the shadow of thy wings."</p>
Saturday 10 May	<input type="checkbox"/> II Sam 24:1-9; <input type="checkbox"/> I Chronicles 21:1-6; 27:23,24; <input type="checkbox"/> II Sam 24:10-14; <input type="checkbox"/> I Chronicles 21:7-13; <input type="checkbox"/> II Sam 24:15-17; <input type="checkbox"/> I Chronicles 21:14-17; <input type="checkbox"/> II Samuel 24:18-25; <input type="checkbox"/> I Chronicles 21:18-30; <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 30	<p>Now we enter David's last days, beginning with his foolish census of the people and the consequences of it. Then he buys a threshing floor for the site of the temple that was to be built by Solomon.</p> <p>In Psalm 30, we read of "Thanksgiving for deliverance from death."</p>
