These psalms are expressions of confidence in God. Psalm 67 is a plea for the name and blessings of God to be known and appreciated all over the earth. Psalm 123 expresses the need for the mercy of God. Psalm 130 is a plea for God to hear and forgive so the people could have hope. Psalm 137 specifically mentions Babylon as their place of captivity and grief.</p>

Daniel 8:1-27

In Daniel 8, the prophet has his vision of the ram and the he goat, two years after chapter 7. The ram refers to Medo-Persia (v. 20) and the he goat refers to Greece (v. 21). These two kingdoms correspond to the second and third kingdoms of Nebuchadnezzar's dream in chapter 2.
